Printz County Commissioner District 2 Statement  Dear Voter: It has been an honor to serve Custer County since the beginning of January. Your Commissioners accomplished a lot in a short time. The most distressing issues handled by the Commissioners have been the neglect and mismanagement left over from prior administrations. As soon as possible, we ended the law suit which cost the County over \$150,000.00 in tax dollars, which was caused by the prior Commissioners' actions. Your current Commissioners instituted job descriptions and performance appraisals for all 80+ County employees, something that has not occurred for over 10 years, if ever. With performance appraisals, employees can be rewarded for exceptional work, rather than the across the board raises that prior Commissioners approved. A new employee manual has been adopted, something again neglected by prior administrations. Additionally, to better serve the public, all County offices that deal directly with the public are staying open until 5pm. Previously, the County offices closed at 4pm. This was done with no employees working more hours (staggered work shifts cover the change). I personally oversaw the completion of the Wetmore Community Center. This project was supposedly close to being completed when I took over, but still took another 6 months to complete due to unexpected problems. Feel free to ask what they were. With a cost of over \$830,000 dollars to upgrade this one building, I seriously question whether such an exorbitant fee could have been scaled down significantly and used to upgrade the Veterans Services Office, Jail, replace road and bridge equipment or repair other County buildings in desperate need of repairs; a gross mismanagement of tax dollars. Hood County Commissioner District 3 Statement "I'm listening, leading, acting and getting results. I take pride in my ability to listen to constituents addressing the issues as they arise and being a voice for all county citizens." In my short eight months of service: 1) I'm using my 36 years of experience as CFO. Policies, procedures and job descriptions have been updated which had not been done in seven years. Rather than across the board salary increases issued in the past, goal setting and evaluations are now in effect to aid in budget and salary increases for the future. 2) First time in recorded history, a budget workshop for elected officials was conducted on July 7, 2017. The training resulted in a documentation stream by which departments will submit budgets, aligned with the need for strategic planning and with an emphasis on the need for elected officials to work together. 3) In the interest of transparency, I have worked with the local newspaper to add the Commissioner's Corner and honored a request to provide an audio link of all BOCC meetings on the county website providing the ability for citizens to be informed. I am keeping my platform promise for all BOCC meetings to be video streamed by the end of the year. 4) In being a responsible senior elected official, I am collaborating with Custer County Economic Development Corporation. We are working towards expanding broadband internet and cell service, to better the quality of life for all citizens, while reinforcing the existing county infrastructure. 5) With no transition from the former commissioners, we expedited the completion of the Wetmore Community Center. Construction problems and deadlines overlooked by the former administration, caused cost overruns and delays.
